



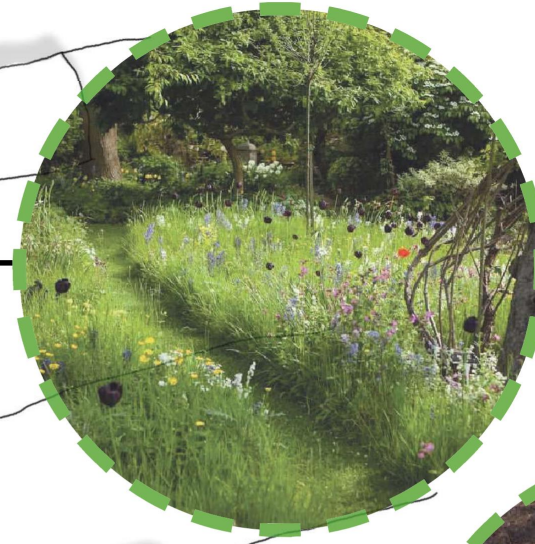
Proposed planting enhances the existing vegetated boundary within rear gardens, filtering external views and providing habitat and foraging opportunity for local wildlife.



Soft landscaping introduced to front gardens in raised beds and atop bin stores. Raised planted elements introduce colour and seasonal flowers creating residential amenity and attracting pollinators.



Native trees with wide canopies soften the visual amenity of the surrounding urban environment. Planting selected to create seasonal interest and landscape structure enhancing the street scene.



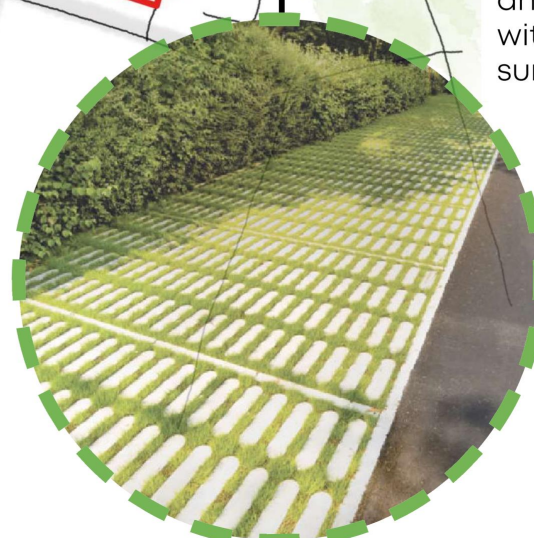
Public open space featuring edible meadow and perimeter hedgerow with orchard trees of local provenance. A space for the local community and local residents. Hedgerow to feature foraging species such as Hazel, Crab Apple and Blackthorn.



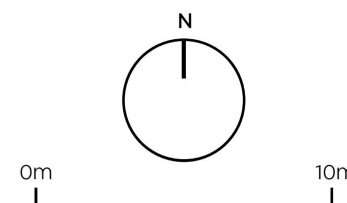
