CERTIFICATE OF LAWFULNESS OF PROPOSED USE OR DEVELOPMENT

The Council of the London Borough of Havering hereby certify that on 27th February 2025 the operations described in the First Schedule to this notice in respect of the land specified in the Second Schedule to this certificate and hatched on the plan attached to this certificate would have been lawful within the meaning of Section 192 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended) for the following reason(s):

- 1 The operations come within the provisions of Section 55 of The Town and Country Planning Act 1990 as amended and therefore the proposal would not require planning permission.

INFORMATIVES

The applicant is advised that the Certificate hereby granted only confirms the lawfulness of the conversion of the garage to a habitable room integral to the dwelling and associated works. The habitable room created through the conversion can only be used only for living accommodation as an integral part of the existing dwelling known as No.12 Balmoral Road, Hornchurch and planning permission would be required for use as a separate unit of residential accommodation.

This certificate provides confirmation that the development is lawful. You should also check whether the development requires separate Building Regulation consent. Notes:

1. This certificate is issued solely for the purposes of Section 192 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

CERTIFICATE OF LAWFULNESS OR MODIFICATION TO DESCRIPTION

- (1) If the applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the local planning authority to refuse permission or to modify the description, an appeal may be made to the First Secretary of State at the Department for Communities and Local Government in accordance with Section 78 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990. (Appeals must be made on a form which is obtainable from the Planning Inspectorate, Customer Support Unit, Temple Quay House, 2 The Square, Temple Quay, Bristol BS1 6PN or from the Planning Inspectorate's web site, www.planning.inspectorate.gov.uk)
- (2) When submitting the completed appeal form to the Planning Inspectorate, a copy be sent to Planning, London Borough of Havering, Town Hall, Main Road, Romford, RM1 3BB. The First Secretary of State has power to allow a longer period for the giving of a notice of appeal but will not normally be prepared to exercise these powers unless there are special circumstances which excuse the delay in giving notice of appeal.
